## *The Pastor's Reflections*

---

**W**e take the theme for this Third Sunday of Advent from Saint Paul. In his first letter to the Thessalonians he commanded them to “*Rejoice always!*” It’s a bit odd, isn’t it? We’re used to hearing commandments that tell us what *not* to do. Don’t steal. Don’t kill. Don’t commit adultery. Don’t worship false gods. But Paul was commanding them to “*REJOICE ALWAYS!*” How can anyone be joyful all the time! Life just isn’t like that. But this teaching of Saint Paul is considered so important that twice during the course of the year, in Advent and in Lent, the Church makes sure that we remember the commandment. Joy is so important that the celebrant of the Mass even dresses in rose-colored vestments on those two days. So let’s think about joy today.

In the Gospel of Luke there’s a very interesting account of Jesus appearing to his disciples after his resurrection. Think of the condition of these disciples. The appearance took place on Sunday. Jesus had been arrested Thursday night. They all fled the scene, but they knew what had taken place throughout the night. Jesus had been shuttled from one place to another, from one authority to another. On Friday, Pilate, to appease the religious leaders, handed down the death penalty. Then the horror began. He was whipped and crucified. Mid-afternoon he died. His body was taken by a disciple and hastily placed in a tomb.

A number of disciples had hidden themselves in an apartment in Jerusalem. They were terrified,

fearing that they might also be arrested. But they were also in spiritual crisis. They had put all their hope and trust in Jesus. He had spoken about a kingdom. They had hoped to be awarded positions of authority in it. Now all their hope had collapsed. There would be no kingdom. They were frightened for their future.

In the scene, two disciples had just returned to the group and were telling them that Jesus was alive. They had seen him, spoken with him, and even eaten a meal with him. As they were relating their experience Jesus appeared to the entire group. He immediately took note of their emotional state. “*Why are your hearts troubled?*”

They felt tremendous joy seeing him, but deep down in their hearts they couldn’t believe what their eyes were seeing. He had to shake them out of

their crippling doubts. “*And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have.’ And as he said this he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous, their joy was great, and they were amazed, he asked them, ‘Have you anything here to eat?’ They gave him a piece of baked fish and he ate it in front of them. (Luke 24:38-43)”*

Take note how physical this scene is. Jesus showed the disciples the scars on his hands and feet. He told them to touch him. He even asked for food, and ate it in their presence. The account is



stressing that Jesus is real, and fully alive. But it's also telling us that the disciples were not yet ready to grasp the full meaning of the resurrection. They needed help. Fear and doubt had crippled them spiritually. The scene ends with Jesus giving them an important message. *"I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high. (Luke 24:49)"* The joy that welled up within them when they first saw him was to grow within them through the power of the Pentecost event.

Fifty days later, when the Spirit came upon the disciples, they experienced a profound freedom. Their fear dissipated. Their minds and hearts were opened and they realized that Jesus was alive and would be with them always. They felt the power of the Holy Spirit in them. Peter immediately left the apartment to address the crowds that were outside. He preached so powerfully that three thousand people became disciples that day. When the Spirit rested on them, the initial joy they felt when they first recognized the resurrected Jesus grew within them. It became their spiritual engine. It would power their lives from that day on.

The early disciples didn't have it easy after the resurrection. All but one of the twelve apostles were martyred. After their deaths the persecution of the Church continued until 313AD. But the disciples of Jesus continued to grow all through those dark days in spite of the challenges, difficulties and danger. That was because the Spirit's gift of joy delivered them from fear. Joy gave them the deep and sure knowledge that God loved them, and was standing by them no matter what difficulties they were facing.

Today, on Gaudete Sunday, the day of joy, we pray for the Holy Spirit to deliver us, like the early Christians, from all our fears. We pray for the Spirit's gift of joy. We pray for the strength and courage to share the Good News that Jesus is resurrected, and is always with us, teaching us, listening to us and eating with us.

Pope Francis has been speaking about joy since the beginning of his pontificate. I'll conclude my reflection with one of his teachings about joy. *"A Christian is a man, or a woman, of joy: a man and a woman with joy in their hearts. There is no Christian without joy! You may be told that there are many such Christians, but they are not Christians! They say that they are, but they are not! They are missing something. The Christian identity card is joy, Gospel joy – the joy of having been chosen by Jesus – the joy of knowing that Jesus is waiting for us. The joy that is expressed even with the crosses and sufferings we bear in this life – the joy which is peace in the certainty that Jesus accompanies us, and is with us."*

**"Brothers and sisters: Rejoice always!"**

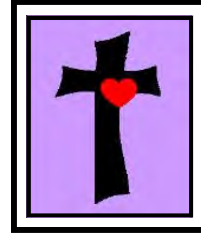

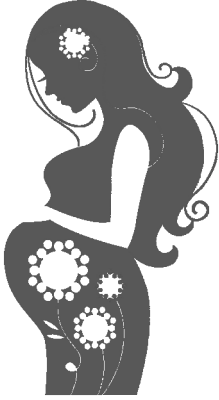

## ST. JEAN BAPTISTE MISSION SOCIETY

On the occasion of Mission Sunday I proposed the establishment of a **MISSION SOCIETY** here at St. Jean's. I extend an invitation to all our parishioners to partner with the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament in India. We have vibrant communities there and many vocations. Our greatest challenge there is the support of our seminarians. Believe it or not, we sometimes have to turn young men away because we cannot cover the costs for their theological education.

The purpose of the **MISSION SOCIETY** would be, first of all, to learn about the work of the Order and its particular mission to India. Secondly, the Society would have the task to stimulate giving throughout the year for the specific purpose of supporting the seminarians' education. Society and the parish at large.

A number of parishioners have already joined this missionary effort. If you are moved to become one of the foundering members of the **MISSION SOCIETY** please leave your name and telephone number at the rectory.

Father Jegaraj, SSS, Provincial Superior of the Indian Province, has sent us pictures of the Novices and Seminarians, and an explanation of the expenses incurred for their formation.

This can be an important mission for our parish community. It will also be a blessing for the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament in India. Thank you for your interest and support.

The Eymardian scholasticate is at Pune, a city three hours' drive from Mumbai. There are 18 students here: 5 Philosophy students and 13 theology students and 2 priests. They are studying in the

seminary run by the Jesuits called Janna Deepa Vedyapeeth. It is a pontifical institute with close to 900 seminarians belonging to most of the dioceses in India, and many religious congregations.

Educational fees for philosophy and theology per year, per student, for two semesters is \$ 307 USD (RS 20000). \$154 USD per semester.

The monthly cost of providing a student with food, clothing, travel expenses, and personal needs is \$75 USD (Rs: 4875).



There are 6 novices at the LaMure Novitiate house in Goa at the moment. It is a two year program consisting of spiritual and religious formation. Here the novices are trained in the life and mission of the Congregation. They are here for the full two years. Since it is a formation program specifically for those interested in joining the Congregation, the Congregation assumes the expenses for education, and boarding. An expected 12 will be joining us in May of 2018, and 5 from this group will move on to the seminary for theological studies in September.

The Average cost of supporting a novice is \$214 USD (Rs 14000) per year.
